Re-entry Information



- In-person learning will return to both Beaver Run campuses on Tuesday, February 2, 2021.
- Students will follow the same hybrid or virtual designation to which they were assigned in the fall, EXCEPT:
 - Parents who responded to Mr. Twilley's survey that went out via email late last week to request a switch from hybrid to virtual have been granted their requests.
 - Parents who submitted an early request to switch from virtual to hybrid have been added to a wait list. Any students that have already been approved would have received a confirmation email from Mrs. Wallace by 4:00 PM today.
- All other requests will be added to our waitlist.
- Please continue to email Mr. Twilley if you wish to be added to the waitlist for hybrid instruction.



Schedules

Early Learning Campus (Y3-Y4)

- Building will open at 8:30 AM
- Classes will begin at 9:00 AM
- Dismissal will take place at 3:30 PM

Main Campus (K-2)

- Building will open at 8:45 AM
 - Classes will begin at 9:15 AM
 - Dismissal will take place at 3:45 PM
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- Students on the virtual schedule will be responsible for logging into Zoom by the time their first class begins.



Instruction



- For the remainder of the year, students in grades K-2 will continue to work with their current homeroom teacher as well as an additional teacher.
- We have decided to make the move to co-teaching pairs of homeroom teachers in order to provide:
 - a more consistent student-adult relationship during teacher absences
 - A more personalized educational experience in whichever educational experience has been selected by the family (hybrid/virtual)



Transportation



- Students will ride their normal buses.
- All routes will run on a daily basis, but please ONLY send your child to school on their assigned days.
- NEW: Until the transportation department is able to determine the student capacity on buses, all students are ONLY eligible for transportations from their residence of record.
 - For daycare, this means that if a student would ride the SAME bus to/from the requested daycare as they would from their home address, it will be allowed.
 - This policy should only be temporary and will be re-evaluated by February 12th.
- Car rider tags MUST be displayed for student pick-up. If you need a tag, please contact the main office for a tag application.



School Meals and COVID Precautions



- All meals will be provided by the school.
 - Parents are still welcome to pack student lunches.
- At this time, students will eat in their classrooms.
- Water will be provided in single-serve bottles to all students. NO water coolers or fountains will be in operation.
- We will continue to serve daily lunches on the bus ramp, from 11:00 AM - 1:00 PM during the spring semester.
- Student areas will be sanitized prior to eating and throughout the day. Each room will be sanitized nightly using a mist.
- Common surfaces, such as bathrooms and doors, are sanitized on an hourly schedule by custodial staff.

School Supplies and Material Distribution



- Our second school wide distribution of school supplies will take place on Wednesday, February 3rd.
- Virtual students will need to come to the main campus to pick up their materials during the school day, or between 4:15 PM - 6:00 PM on the bus ramp.
- Hybrid students will have their supplies delivered to their classrooms so that they can bring them home.
- Please encourage your student to use the backpack that was sent home to keep their school materials organized and ready for use during instruction.



Technology Notes



- Students will need to use their laptops for both in-person and virtual instruction.
- Please be sure that students bring their laptop AND charger to school every day.
- Please continue to handle devices with care.
 - As a county, we have seen a spike in damage to devices.
 - Fines will now be issued for lost/damaged devices and charging cords.





Consistent Attire Program (CAP)

- We will begin enforcing CAP attire on February 16th.
 - Until that time, students are permitted to wear any clothing that adheres to the dress code policies of Wicomico County Public Schools
