Mission Statement: The mission of Wicomico Middle School is to provide, within a safe environment, a strong educational foundation for all our students, nurture them through their transitional years, and encourage them to become responsible and productive citizens.

Priority Statement # 1: Academic Achievement

Based on data and discussions around MD Report Card, students will increase overall scores on the MCAP, with a targeted focus on the Students with Disabilities (SWD) subgroup and the Students who are ELL subgroup.

SMART Goals

- Using the Assessment Performance Results- 2019, the percent of Wicomico Middle students scoring proficient or higher on ELA MCAP will increase from 26% in 2018/2019 to 28.5% in 2019/2020.
- Using the Assessment Performance Results- 2019, the percent of Wicomico Middle students scoring proficient or higher on math MCAP will increase from 15.1% in 2018/2019 to 18.6% in 2019/2020.
- Using the Assessment Performance Results- 2019, the percent of Wicomico Middle students with disabilities (SWD) scoring proficient or higher on ELA MCAP will increase from 0% in 2018/2019 to 5% in 2019/2020.
- Using the Assessment Performance Results- 2019, the percent of Wicomico Middle students with disabilities (SWD) scoring proficient or higher on math MCAP will increase from 1.1% in 2018/2019 to 6.1% in 2019/2020.
- Using the Assessment Performance Results- 2019, the percent of Wicomico Middle students who are ELL scoring proficient or higher on ELA MCAP will increase from 3.4% in 2018/2019 to 8.4% in 2019/2020.
- Using the Assessment Performance Results- 2019, the percent of Wicomico Middle students who are ELL scoring proficient or higher on math MCAP will increase from 1.4% in 2018/2019 to 6.4% in 2019/2020.
- Using the September 2019 and April 2020 Reading Inventory assessment scores, at least 50% of Wicomico Middle students will raise their RI scores by 50 points or maintain an Advanced Performance Band.

Priority Statement # 2 School Quality and Student Success

Based on discussion and data collected through MD report Card, school quality and student success is a priority area, specifically targeting attendance, access to well-rounded curriculum (with a targeted focus on the Students with Disabilities (SWD) subgroup) and progress in achieving EL proficiency.

SMART Goals

- The percent of Wicomico Middle School students chronically absent will decrease from 29.4% in 2017/2018 to 25% in 2019/2020.
- The percent of Wicomico Middle School students with disabilities (SWD) chronically absent will decrease from 42.6% in 2017/2018 to 38% in 2019/2020.
- Access to a well-rounded curriculum for Wicomico Middle School students will increase from 93.4% in 2017/2018 to 98% in 2019/2020.
- Access to a well-rounded curriculum for Wicomico Middle School students with disabilities (SWD) will increase from 44.4% in 2017/2018 to 60% in 2019/2020.
- The percent of Wicomico Middle School EL students making progress towards EL proficiency will increase from 57.1% to (look at scores on 21st)

Priority Statement # 3 School Climate

Based on qualitative data and quantitative data, overall student referrals (along with a focus on classroom disruption, tardiness, class cutting, and disrespect) will decrease.

SMART Goal

- The overall number of Wicomico Middle School student discipline referrals will be reduced from 2850 in 2018/2019 to 2423 in 2019/2020.
- The number of Wicomico Middle School student disruption referrals will be reduced from 945 in 2018/2019 to 851 in 2019/2020.
- The number of Wicomico Middle School student tardiness referrals will be reduced from 663 in 2018/2019 to 597 in 2019/2020.
- The number of Wicomico Middle School student class cutting referrals will be reduced from 234 in 2018/2019 to 211 in 2019/2020.
- The number of Wicomico Middle School student disrespect referrals will be reduced from 600 in 2018/2019 to 540 in 2019/2020.
