SECONDARY SUMMER SCHOOL GUIDELINES

Please be aware that due to the accelerated nature of summer school, guidelines are more stringent than during the traditional school year. Please remember that summer school is an opportunity and a privilege.

Students are expected to follow the Wicomico County Public Schools Code of Conduct.

Classes will be held Monday through Thursday, beginning June 28th and ending Aug 5th. Secondary Summer School is closed July 5th. Middle School students will be split into two sessions. The first session will be held from June 28th through July 19th. Middle school students with the names between A and K will be in Session 1. Session 2 will be held from July 20th through August 5th and will serve students with last names between L and Z

Breakfast and Lunch will be available to all students who are registered in any secondary summer program. Breakfast is served from 8:53 – 8:59 AM.

Attendance/Lateness and Make up Policies

- Daily attendance throughout the program is mandatory
- Students are expected to be in the classroom and ready to work when class starts. Class times 9AM for first period and 11:05 AM for second period. Lateness is defined as arrival in the classroom after the bell has rung. Due to the compressed nature of the academic program, there are **NO EXCUSED ABSENCES** and/or **LATENESSES** in Summer School.
- **Students may be withdrawn from the course if they accumulate the equivalent of more than 2 days.**
- Two (2) latenesses (less than 30 minutes each) will be equivalent to one absence from school. A lateness equal to or greater than 30 minutes will be equivalent to an absence and the student will be sent home. Early departure from school will be considered a lateness/absence according to the above guidelines.

Withdrawal and Suspension:

- **SMOKING OR VAPING IS NOT PERMITTED. USE OR POSSESSION OF ALCOHOL, TOBACCO OR TOBACCO-RELATED PRODUCTS, DRUGS, WEAPONS, ELECTRONIC DEVICES SUCH AS CELL PHONES, MUSIC DEVICES, ETC., are also prohibited.** This policy applies to possession as well as actual use. Banned items will be confiscated and appropriate disciplinary action including possible expulsion from Summer School will be taken.

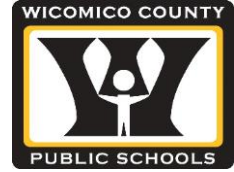

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- Should a student’s behavior result in suspension from summer school, the suspension will affect all classes the student attends on the day of suspension and will count as an absence.
- If a student is withdrawn for behavior problems, non-attendance, or abuse of the attendance/lateness policy, or academic performance.

Report Cards:

Please note the dates when report cards will be issued. The first report card will be sent home with students on **July 20th, 2021**. The final report card will be mailed home on or about **August 9th, 2021**. The student’s home school will be notified of completion status the week after summer school ends.

Other Policies:

Building Access: Students are not to block the doorway at the building’s entrance, nor are they to loiter in hallways before, between, or after classes. Building access is limited only to those areas used by Secondary Summer School. Students are expected to leave school grounds immediately after their last class/program each day.

Phone: Students will be permitted to use the summer school office phone for emergencies only. Cell Phones can only be used for instructional purposes at the discretion of the classroom teacher.

Attire: Student dress code will be enforced. Refer to the Wicomico County Dress Code Policy for specific details. Students will not be allowed in class if they do not meet the dress code.
